

WHAT WE DO

To achieve its purpose, IPI employs a mix of policy research, strategic analysis, publishing, and convening. IPI partners with regional organizations, think tanks, universities, and NGOs to conduct research, produce publications, and organize meetings around the world. IPI primarily carries out its work in and on Africa, the Middle East, Europe, and Central Asia. IPI provides practical policy insight and advice for international and national policymakers, as well as for the broader foreign affairs community. Among the consumers of its policy research and analysis are the UN and its 193 member states, regional and subregional organizations, academia, and civil society. With its Trygve Lie Center for Peace, Security & Development affording IPI unique convening capacity, the institute conducts much of its work through meetings with diplomats, government officials, and experts from the UN community and world capitals. This establishes a trustful atmosphere for searching, unbiased discussion and debate and provides a forum for finding common ground among parties engaged in negotiation in otherwise politicized environments. IPI’s policy recommendations are highly valued for their candor and credibility.

MANAGING RISK & BUILDING RESILIENCE

IPI's work is framed around the strategic goal of managing risk and building resilience for a more peaceful and secure world. This approach emphasizes the need for strategic anticipation, proactive response, and long-term engagement. It also provides a framework for cooperation across institutional silos and geographic boundaries.

IPI's **Brian Urquhart Center for Peace Operations** bolsters efforts to reform the UN's peace and security architecture, to ensure peacekeepers have the support they need to fulfill their mandates, and to improve policies for sustaining peace. IPI's research on **Sustainable Development** examines how to advance the cause of peace through the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Our work on **Humanitarian Affairs** focuses on the

challenge of delivering healthcare during armed conflict, and IPI's dedicated program on **Women, Peace, and Security** concentrates on women's leadership and delivering on the promise of including gender perspectives in all of the UN's peace and security work.

The Global Observatory (www.theglobalobservatory.org) publishes data-driven articles authored by leading experts and policymakers, covering issues of peace, security, and development.

Sharpening its international profile and regional outreach, IPI has established an office in Vienna, home to a number of regional and international organizations, and a Middle East regional office in Manama.




EVENTS

IPI organizes over 120 events in New York, Vienna, Manama, and elsewhere internationally each year, ranging from intimate discussions and workshops to on-the-record presentations featuring world leaders, foreign policy experts, and noted authors speaking on pressing issues in global affairs. All public events are webcast on IPI's website and include question-and-answer sessions. IPI's convening serves to build strategic partnerships with key actors in the UN community, academia, the private sector, and civil society.

IPI has published more than 450 books and papers that are widely read and used by policymakers and practitioners. IPI publications have received more than 12,000 academic citations.
